

## Compromisos aprobados

### COMP 2 on Recommendation 5

**Covering AM 18** by Thomas Waitz, **AM 19** by Marina Albiol Guzman

5. Calls on national, regional and local authorities and the Guadalquivir Water Authority to continue working together and encourage closing all the illegal wells and to immediately stop existing illegal water extraction and illegal abstraction, thus as a precautionary measure and stopping use of unlicensed infrastructure (intake from streams, ponds) by immediately decommissioning it; and calls to protect the inspectors and to reinforce their work by increasing the existing material and human resources;

### COMP 4 on Recommendation 9

**Covering AM 29** by Thomas Waitz; **AM 30** by Marina Albiol Guzmán; **AM 50** Soledad Cabezón;

9 Calls for more effective purification of the water flowing into Doñana and for the widespread pollution of farming and industrial origin to be reduced; notes that not all agriculture in the area of Huelva is a threat to the Doñana Natural Park, but the illegal and uncontrolled extraction of water; highlights the importance of reducing water stress by halting the illegal and uncontrolled extraction of water, as well as providing farmers with the necessary resources and technology to adapt to the challenges of climate change seeking to preserve environmental sustainability of the area in balance with the economic development; calls for proper purification and continuous monitoring of water flowing into Doñana; notes with concern that the amount of water to be treated is greater than the actual purification plant's capacity, particularly during summer periods; calls on the Commission to set in motion a Special Plan for Sustainability and Preservation of Doñana Park and its surroundings;

### COMP 5 on NEW Recommendation 10a

10a. Points out its deep concern since a partial authorisation for developing a private project for storing gas in the subsoil of Doñana was approved without requesting a holistic and complete Environmental Impact Assessment which included a seismic evaluation and a combined impact assessment; recalls that the project cannot be divided into four different sub-projects in order to avoid evaluating its combined impact; calls on the Commission to assess the whole dossier and report in writing on the adequacy of the environmental impact assessments as presented in four separate parts and on the procedure of dividing into four sub-projects, as opposed to taking into account the cumulative effect of the overall risks and to verify that these assessments evaluate the overall seismic risks; calls on the Commission to take into account the report by the CSIC, the report by the Andalusian ombudsman and the report carried out by the Geological Institute of Spain; considers that, under such circumstances, the project should not have received a positive environmental impact statement and calls for it to be withdrawn;

### **COMP 6 on NEW Recommendation 10b**

**Covering AM 34** Marina Albiol, **AM 42** Thomas Waitz

10b. Calls on the responsible authorities to carry out specifically, as foreseen in article 3(2) in the Environmental Impact Assessment directive, an assessment internalizing the cost of any possible works needed to reverse the situation in the event of a catastrophe linked to the gas storage operations and also report on the necessary measures to be taken and their cost in case of major accidents and/or disasters related to the gas project,); stresses that such evaluation should be conducted in accordance with common methodology applied in the worst-case catastrophe risk assessment, namely integrate all the threats such as seism, flood, or aquifer pollution and contain an inventory detailing environmental, social and economic losses and the estimated cost for a hypothetical restoration; considers as well that in order to offer a complete risk analysis tool to the authorities this quantification should encompass the intrinsic value of the environmental losses in terms of ecosystems, as well as social and economic losses, starting with the agriculture and tourism sectors;

### **COMP 7 on NEW Recommendation 10c**

10c. Calls on the Commission, bearing in mind the high added value for the EU of the Doñana Natural Park, and the possible risks of works of extraction and storage of gas (by injection), the possible consequences which have not been studied, and whose antecedent in Spain, a similar case "El Castor" revealed the seismic risks inherent to this type of infrastructure, to rule on the appropriateness of applying the precautionary principle and the consequent cessation of the projects of gas storage; recommends to all the responsible authorities to work together to immediately suspend all the permits granted until all irregularities detected on the Environmental Impact Assessment are dealt with; calls for the interim withdrawal of these works and to immediately stop any further steps in the gas project in order to ensure respect for the EU principles of prevention and precaution; suggests that the necessary legal steps be taken with a view to putting an end to the whole Marismas Project;
